Briefings

As a special treat for our guests, during our 10th-anniversary session, we will offer two 45-minute briefings with distinguished members of the United Nations. Participating delegations will receive a form where they will be able to submit their questions for the experts to answer.



The Chief of Mission of the International Organization for Migration (IOM) in Uruguay, Ms Lucila Pizzarulli, took her first steps in the United Nations in 2016 as a volunteer for the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO). In 2019, she began her career at the IOM in Uruguay as a project assistant. A year later, she became the Coordinator of Assistance and Protection of Migrants and at the end of 2020, she was promoted to Program Coordinator. She has been serving in her current position since January 2023.



The United Nations Logistics Officer, Mr Marcelo Warnes has been a UN Peacekeeper since 2008 when he began his service as a Geographic Information Officer in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). In 2011, he became an Inspector of peacekeeping contingents in DRC, until he started as Second in Command of Movement and Control in Haiti in 2014. Three years later, he was promoted to Chief of the Coordination Center of Movement and Control in Haiti. From 2018 to 2021, he worked for the Logistics Division of the UN Headquarters in New York. Currently, he is a UN Logistics Officer in Entebbe, Uganda.

Fees and Payment

All attending delegations must pay a school fee depending on the number of delegates attending the conference (all fees are expressed in Uruguayan pesos):

School fee

Small delegations	1 to 10 students	\$U1.700
Medium-sized delegations	11 to 20 students	\$U3.300
Large delegations	21 to 30 students	\$U4.900

The cost of the participation of MUN Directors is included in the school fee.

Schools attending the conference with more than thirty (30) delegates must contact lamun@british.edu.uy for details about the corresponding fee.

Additionally, each delegate must pay a delegate fee:

The fees include refreshments; however, they do not include lunch on the first and second days of the conference.

Participants may bring a packed lunch or leave the premises during the lunch break to buy their meals at neighbouring shops and restaurants. Nonetheless, they are not allowed to order food to be delivered at the conference venue.

Moreover, the catering service at the British Schools offers a lunch menu for a fee of \$U 390 (three hundred and ninety Uruguayan pesos). Participants who wish to buy this menu must indicate it in Form 1 and pay the lunch fee together with the school and delegate fees.
